FILIPPO ARCURI 66 died May 3, 1947, at the home of his daughter Mrs. Anthony Cittadino. 644 Broad, after a long illness. He was born in Castagna Province of Catanzaro, Italy. Nov 11, 1880 (must be a misprint, his grave stone says 1871. His son Joseph Arcuri verified it to be 1871) a son of the late Francesco and Maria Gueseppe Scalise Arcuri. He was married 46 years ago to Rosa Maria DeFazio in Italy and came to this country and to Utica in 1904. Mrs Arcuri died here Nov. 28, 1939. The deceased was employed for a number of years prior to retirement by the New York Central Railroad and was a member of the Brotherhood of Railway and Steamship Clerks. He was a member of St. Mary of Mt. Carmel Church. Surviving are three sons. Frank, Joseph and Sam Arcuri all of Utica: four daughters, Mrs Paul LaTella, Mrs Cittadino, Mrs. Salvi Mazza and Mrs. Santo Falbo also of this city a sister, Mrs. Antionette Talerico and several nieces, nephews and grandchildren. The funeral will be held from the home of his daughter, Mrs. Cittadino 644 Broad at a time to be announced.

Note : Filippo AKA Philip arrived in the U.S. in 1884 /85. He lived with his uncle, Antonio Damanico, in Delanson, NY. Filippo worked and saved his money. His uncle was killed by a train. Filippo used his life's savings to bury his uncle. Filippo then moved to an area on the Hudson. He lived with a Welch family there.

He later worked for the H.B. Cary Brick Yard, on the Hudson River. Filippo was multi-lingual and held the position of Overseer. He spoke Italian, Galic and English. As a young man, Filippo saved enough money to return to Italy and marry Rosa Maria DeFazio. Rosa Maria, became pregnant in Italy. Angelina was born there. The couple returned to the USA and lived in the Hudson River area of NY State. Later, he moved to Utica, NY and purchased a home at 644 Broad St.

Note : Filippo and Antoinetta possibly had two brothers that remained in Italy. Presently, there is no documentation of this.

While reflecting on Aunt Antoinette's life, my mind and my heart focus on the words taken from the song which we sang at communion time. It is entitled: We Remember. The beautiful refrain reads like a poem : We remember how you loved us to your death, and still we celebrate for you are with us here; and we believe that we will see you when you come in your glory, Lord. We Remember, We Celebrate, We Believe.

Antoinette Arcuri Falbo always and everywhere was remembering, always and everywhere was celebrating, always and everywhere was a beautiful, believing person.

When Aunt Antoinette was recently hospitalized in Huntsville, I recall my conversation with Angela. Angela knew well that her Mom's life was transitioning closer to God as she spoke and updated me on Aunt A's condition. Then, in a moment, Angela paused and said, "Richard, how I wish I had recorded all of Mom's stories." During the wake, we shared stories about Aunt Antoinette and we also shared many stories which she told about each of us. After this liturgy, I am certain, we will continue to carry on Aunt Antoinette's tradition of storytelling since she really was our family's loving librarian, archivist and storyteller par excellence. All her storytelling points to what she held most precious in her heart. Her's was a heart steeped in deep and unblemished appreciation for each of us and every story was a celebration of her affection and concern for a family member or friend. Aunt Antoinette was most certainly like Christ, the greatest storyteller who was always trying to show us the love in his heart through his ageless parables, through his marvelous stories.

A friend who was studying theology once asked me if I knew what is at the heart of Catholic liturgy, Catholic worship. I don't recall my response, but I do recall his. He said the heart of liturgy is remembrance. In the liturgy we are always celebrating by remembering Christ's tremendous love

for each of us. At each Eucharistic liturgy, we hear Christ's request for our memories with His words: "Do this in remembrance of me." Today, as we celebrate with Christ this liturgy in remembrance and appreciation of Aunt Antoinette's good life, we may come to see more clearly how her gentle heart mirrored the remembering heart of her Creator. In the common, ordinary, unspectacular flow of her daily life, Aunt Antoinette, through remembrance, held closely the ones she loved and she celebrated these

stories not only with family and friends, but also with people whom she met on airplanes, in super markets and at parties. From this perspective, I can easily say that she was always and everywhere remembering to celebrate the liturgy of familial love and devotion.

Aunt Antoinette celebrated life and love through stories but also through visits. She was not only the storyteller par excellence but also the most congenial, interested and warm visitor. Her coming for a visit was not only to share conversation and, of course, stories, but also to serve, to help. I will never forget her visit when I was living in Milton, Massachusetts. With Sandra, Neil, Julie and Roland, Aunt Antoinette and I went to see an Andrew Wyeth exhibit at Boston's Museum of Fine Arts. After viewing the exhibit, we went to the Brothers' House in Milton. I had prepared supper in advance. The only thing left was to grill the chicken. I kept on thinking that this in the first and maybe the only time when I could cook for my Aunt who had cooked for me countless times. I did not want her to do a thing. Then the unforgettable moment arrived. Just as the meal came to an end, Aunt A opened her purse and took out her apron. With Br. Bartholomew and, without invitation or hesitation, she went into the kitchen and took care of the dishes. I was both amused and inspired by this loving gesture. I was also shocked. This unforgettable gesture always reminds me again of my Aunt's motherly, care-giving and generous heart. She was always and everywhere serving her family with kindness and care.. I can still picture the apron and that apron has taken on Eucharistic meaning for me. One Holy Thursday, I heard a homily based on Christ's washing the feet of his disciples. The homilist kept underscoring how Christ's compassionate heart was truly exemplified through service to his friends. He also added that the only vestment Christ ever wore was an apron when he was washing his disciples' feet. My wonderful Aunt always had her vestment, always had her apron ready, like Christ, to serve and to care for each of us.

We may ask - How was Aunt Antoinette's heart formed in such lavish remembrance and joyful celebration of family life and love? My simple response would be - She was blessed with a trusting heart, a believing heart that was formed and nurtured in this parish community for over eight decades. She and Uncle Sam cherished everything about this parish and with much openness and affirmation, she even embraced many of the liturgical changes of the Vatican II Church, especially the lively, contemporary music. The music selections for this liturgy are among her favorite songs.

Just after her passing, I spoke with Rosemary. Rosemary told me that her Mother died peacefully and while she was passing over to God, Christian music was playing at her bedside. During her final hours, her cherished and beloved daughters prayed for her, blessed and anointed her and sang beautiful songs. Her sons-in-law, grand children and friends filled her room with blessings of good-bye and expressions of gratitude and love. Her dying was so faithful to the way she lived her life where each moment was peopled with loving remembrances, peace-filled celebrations and utter trust and belief in the Personal Mystery of God's loving presence.

And so, my imagination now turns to the heavenly concert and family reunion taking place where Aunt Antoinette is reunited with Uncle Sam, with her parents and sisters, Angeline, Christina and Rose, with her brothers, Frank, Joe and Sam and , if my imagination serves me well, I picture her apologizing to our dear relatives, my sister Elaine and cousin Phil What a shame!" she says, " I did not attend your funerals.

Celebrate well this wonderful reunion, dear Aunt. And know well that we your family and friends
